SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First-aid Measures

7.1. Precautions for Safe Handling

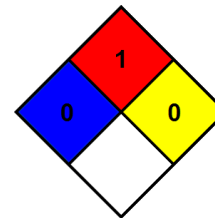
